PREAMBLE: The add-on course in disaster management in Nursing is offered by Yenepoya Nursing College. The overall aim of this course is to incorporate specialized body of knowledge and improve skill of student Nurses in disaster victim care in order to enable them to lead quality life.

Scope and need: Nurses are key members of the disaster response teams and are often the largest contingent of professionals on hand at a disaster site. Nurses role in disaster becomes all the more significant in view of their ability to provide both individual care and to deal with people's needs. In order to further strengthen their effective contributions, student nurses need to be further enabled with the necessary know-how in addressing psychosocial and environmental health issues in addition to strengthening basic skill related to emergency relief and health care. In this context, the training package has been designed to equip nursing students with additional skill in outreach services to communities in the reconstruction and rehabilitation phase.

Career opportunities:

After the completion of course nurse can work at Hospitals, Non- governmental agencies, Governmental, Insurance companies, Defence nurse, Emergency nurse.
