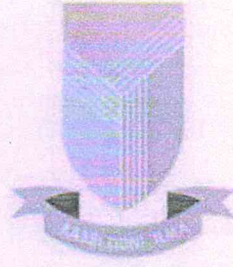

1. Preamble-

Skill acquisition is an essential components for surgical trainees during their PG career has they start their training from novice to proficient level. - To make the students to perform common techniques of Intestinal Anastomosisby hands sewn and stapler methods.


5. **Duration of the course** – 17 hours.In the month of September, every academic year.
