MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING
Between

Narayana Dental College & Hospital ; Narayana Nursing College, Nellore
AND
Centre for Ethics, Yenepoya University, Mangalore

This Memorandum of Understanding (Agreement) is made and entered into by Narayana Dental College and Hospital and Narayana Nursing College located in Chinthareddypalem, Nellore with the Center for Ethics, Yenepoya University located at Deralakatte, Mangalore.

RECITALS

Whereas the institutions are linked by common academic and healthcare interests;
Whereas the institutions wish to enable cooperation and exchange in all academic and healthcare areas of mutual interests; and

Whereas the institutions wish to enable cooperation and exchange in all academic and healthcare areas of mutual interests; and

Whereas the institutions wish to develop the basis for better understanding of bioethics, their implementation in research protocols & processes utilizing the faculty and facilities available in both the institutions;

Therefore, in consideration of their mutual interests and the covenants set forth herein, the institutions agree as follows:

ARTICLE 1

PURPOSE AND SCOPE OF THE AGREEMENT

1.01 **Purpose.** The purposes of this agreement include, but are not limited to the following:

- a) Training of Staff in different aspects of Bioethics ;
- b) Guidance & Support for Development of Bioethics Center in Narayana Dental & Nursing Institutions;
- c) Organizing joint academic and scientific activities such as courses, conferences, seminars, symposia, or lectures;
- d) Exchange of research and teaching personnel;
- e) Exchange of publications and other materials of common interest.

1.02 **Scope.** Cooperative projects under this agreement may include any of the academic disciplines represented at either of the institutions.

ARTICLE 2

PROPOSED ACTIVITIES PURSUANT TO THE AGREEMENT

2.01 **Institutional Appointees.** In order to carry out and fulfill the aims of this agreement, each institution will appoint an appropriate person at each of their campuses to coordinate the development and conduct of joint activities. Through these contact persons, either institution may initiate proposals for activities under this agreement. The contact persons will additionally be responsible for evaluation of activities under this agreement according to the practices of their respective institutions.

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2.02 **Supplemental Agreements.** Activities the institutions mutually agree to undertake are subject to further agreement of the institutions & must be set forth in supplemental agreement signed by authorized representatives of each institution. Supplemental agreements should include specific details of the agreed upon activity, including items such as : (a) elaboration of responsibilities of each institution for the agreed upon activity; (b) schedules for specific activities; (c) budgets & sources of financing for each activity; (d) any other items necessary for efficient conduct of the activity and (e) any other items necessary to meet the legal and policy requirements of each institution. Supplemental agreements are subject to approval by each institution according to the normal policies & procedures governing the types of activities proposed therein.

ARTICLE 3

TERM AND TERMINATION

3.01 **Term.** This agreement shall take effect upon signature by both institutions and, unless terminated earlier shall continue for a period of five years from the date of signing this document by the authorities of both Institutions.

3.02 **Extension.** This agreement maybe extended by mutual agreement of concerned institutions in writing and signed by the Head/In charge of both Institutions.

3.03 **Termination.** This agreement may be terminated at any time by either institution after giving written notice of the same to the other institution. Any Supplemental agreements entered into by the institutions maybe continued or terminated at termination of this M.O.U. and specific details of the same must be mentioned in the termination notice along with reasons for the termination.

ARTICLE 4

MISCELLANEOUS

4.01 **Recognition.** Narayana Dental College & Hospital & Narayana Nursing College are recognized as post graduate training centre by the Government of India and by the Dr.N. T. R. University of Health Sciences of Andhra Pradesh.

4.02 The staff from Narayana Dental College & Narayana Nursing College maybe deputed to the Center for Ethics, Yenepoya University, Mangalore to get training in different aspects of Bioethics with information to & approval of Center for Ethics, Yenepoya University, Mangalore.

5.01 **Jurisdiction.** The legal jurisdiction of this agreement shall be interpreted and enforced within Nellore, State of Andhra Pradesh, India. Any claims arising out of this agreement shall be subject to the jurisdiction of Civil court of Nellore.

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**Centre for Ethics, Yenepoya University
Workshop in Biomedical Ethics in Research
Narayana Dental College and Narayana Nursing College
Nellore, Andhra Pradesh**

The Centre for Ethics, Yenepoya University, as a part of an MoU signed with Narayana Dental College, Nellore, conducted its first Workshop titled Bioethics in Healthcare and Research at Narayana Dental College, Nellore, Andhra Pradesh on 12 and 13 April, 2017.

The workshop was attended by about 60 faculty members of the two institutions including the Deans of the two institutions and four ethics committee members. The members actively participated and benefited from the workshop.

The two institutions have undergraduate and postgraduate students who conduct research as a part of their academic training. Although there is an ethics committee (EC) in place, it is not registered with DCGI. Hence both, the dental and nursing institutions are keen on developing ethics committees in their institutions with the guidance of the Centre for Ethics.

The faculty members who went to Nellore as resource persons were Dr. Vina Vaswani, Director, CFE, Dr. Uma Kulkarni, Professor, Ophthalmology, and Dr. Ravi Vaswani, Professor, Internal Medicine, Yenepoya Medical College, Yenepoya University.

Eight sessions were conducted over two full days. Each session had a spectrum of examples of ethical issues pertinent to the topics covered. The sessions were interspersed with interactions with the participants and ended with questions and discussions.

The sessions conducted by the three resource persons included an overview of moral reasoning, ethical principles and theories, ethics of research, vulnerability, guidelines and ethics committee functioning. Each session had a power-point presentation, relevant videos and discussions.

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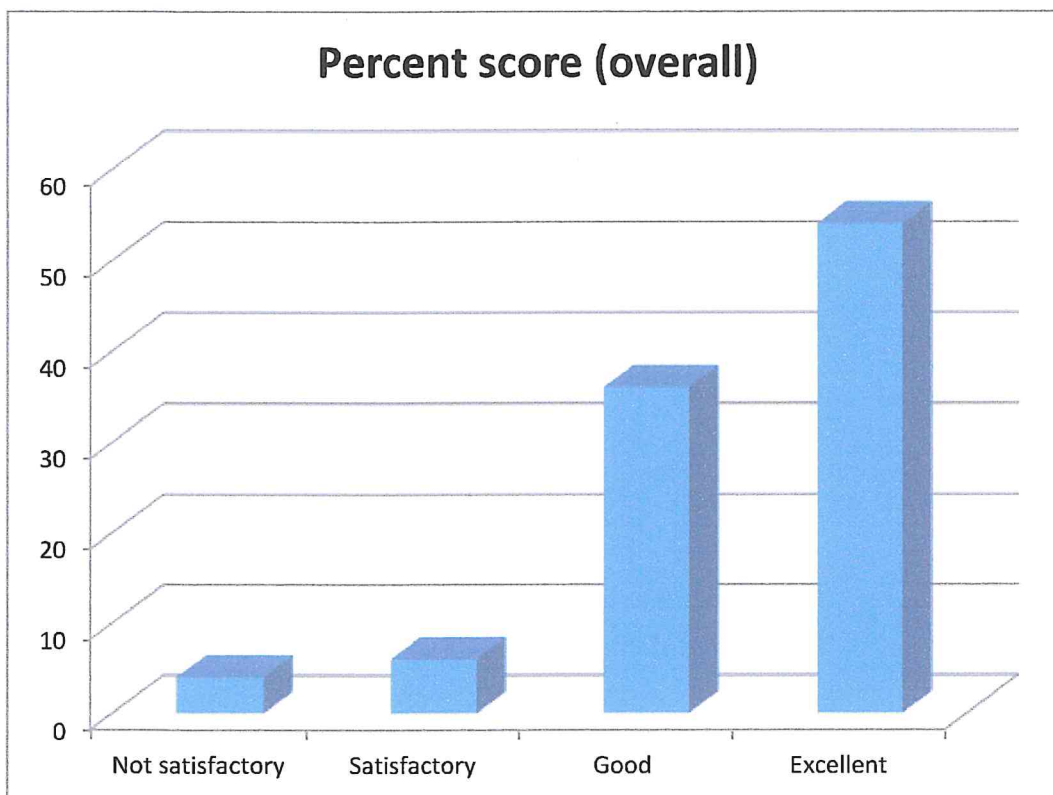


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The overall feedback by the participants was very good. Ninety percent of the participants rated the workshop as good or excellent. Some of the participants have expressed their willingness to pursue the PGDBEME course in Yenepoya University. The EC members have expressed their interest in visiting the YUEC in order to observe the working of the YUEC. The Deans have expressed their interest in establishing ethics committees in their institutions.

The CFE faculty is extremely thankful to the organisers of the workshop for the warm hospitality and valuable feedback. The CFE is looking forward for more training sessions in future.
