# Report on $11^{\text {th }}$ Intensive Summer Workshop in Ethics and Research (I-SWEAR) - 17 to 21 May 2021 

## PROGRAM REPORT

Since the country still needs more persons to get trained in bioethics, so that their contribution within the IEC becomes more meaningful. Therefore, CFE as a part of Intensive Summer Workshop in Ethics and Research (I-SWEAR) program offers EC mentoring and GCP training to enable the participants to be trained on basic ethical principles and assure the safety, integrity, and quality of clinical trials by addressing elements related to the design, conduct, and reporting of clinical trials.

The main focus of the workshop was to empower participants to understand locating ethics in research from historical wrongs. To explore areas of research involving human participants. To train people who is serving on institutional human ethics committees; or are likely to serve in the coming years, to give them the knowledge and tools to recognize and deal with various ethical issues arising out of research being done on human subjects. The course also trained participants in Good Clinical Practice (GCP) along guidelines of the International Council for Harmonization (ICH).

- Students of M.Sc Research Ethics Students.
- In-house and external participants from various disciplines: Pharmacology, Paediatrics, Ophthalmology, Advocate, Ayurveda, Hospital Administration, Clinical psychology,Public health dentistry, Oral and maxillofacial surgery, Oral medicine and radiology, ethics committee, Community medicine, Physiology, Pathology, Physiotherapy, Nursing, Independent researcher,Curator, Salesperson, Social science and Humanities


## Sessions

Converted $3^{\text {rd }}$ and $4^{\text {th }}$ modules of the Post Graduate Diploma in Bioethics and Medical Ethics into online modules. Following are the sessions conducted during the four days online workshop.

Day 1: What is research?, Ethics of clinical practice and clinical research, Methodology for ethical analysis: principles and theories, Vulnerability of research participants.

Day 2: Voluntary informed consent, Privacy and confidentiality in biomedical research, Assessment of risks and benefits in clinical research, Laws and regulations related to clinical trials, Formation of ethics committees and protocols for mock ethics review.

Day 3: Regulations for SAE and compensation, Practical aspects of scientific and economic organization of clinical trials, Ethics committees: Institutional and Independent, Conflict of Interests, Standard of care, Post trial access, Groups discussion on mock proposal.

Day 4: Scientific misconduct, ICMR COVID research guidelines for ethics committees, Research in disaster, Meeting of mock ethics committee and presentation, Ethical use of animals in research, Community engagement in research.

## Training method

1. The workshop was conducted 'online' in view of the COVID-19 pandemic related lockdown and travel restrictions, using Zoom platform.
2. The sessions included interactive lectures using power point presentation and educational short movies with appropriate examples.
3. The session was interspersed with interaction with the participants and clarification of doubts.
4. The participants were divided into three groups and assigned them with the mock proposals. Each group was asked to enact the role of the ethics committee individually and put forth their opinion on the mock proposals received by them.

## DEPARTMENT OF PSYCHIATRIC NURSING VIRTUAL PANEL DISCUSSION ON MENTAL HEALTH FOR ALL: GREATER INVESTMENT GREATER ACCESS

In the light of World Mental Health Day, the Department of Psychiatric Nursing has organized a virtual panel discussion on the theme "Mental health for all: Greater Investment-Greater access" on 10 October 2020 at $11.00 \mathrm{am}-12.30 \mathrm{pm}$. The session was started with a welcome address by Mrs.Thejaswini Padua A Kallan, Lecturer. She welcomed all the delegates and panelists to the program. Mrs.Viji Prasad.C, Assistant Professor introduced the moderator of the session, Dr.Syed Imran, HOD, Department of Psychiatric Nursing. The panel discussion opened up by giving a brief overview on the theme of the world mental health day 2020 and introducing all the panelists by the moderator.Panelists were;

1. Dr. Sreevani Rentala, Department of Mental Health Nursing, Dharwad Institute of Mental Health, and Neurosciences.
2. Dr. RadhakrishnanGovindan, Ph.D., FISPN, Assoc. Professor, Department of Nursing, College of Nursing, NIMHANS (INI), Bengaluru.
3. Dr.Nageshwar V Reddy, Asst. Professor, Nursing Department, Faculty of Applied Medical Sciences, Al Baha Province, Kingdom of Saudi Arabia.
4. Dr.SanthoshPrabu, Assistant Professor, Department of Psychiatry, K.S. Hegde Medical Academy, Mangaluru.
Dr.Sreevani Rentala is deliberated on the topic of mental health as a human right and the protection of rights of patients with mental illness. She stressed the issues related to mental health services such as ineffective budget allocation for mental health services (Worldwide, only $7 \%$ of the health budget is allocated), stigma attached to mental illness, and discrimination of people with mental illness. Dr. Sreevani also explained the legislative mechanism to protect the rights of people with mental illness, the need for mental health facilities should be available in all the levels where the physical care services are provided, and the role of the psychiatric nurses to disseminate this awareness among the public.
Dr.Santhosh Prabu discussed on the topics "Unprecedented impact of the current global health emergency due to COVID-19". During the discussion, he noted the stress imposed by the COVID pandemic all over the world, lack of facilities like infrastructure and health services, influence on the availability of health services, and impact on socio-economic domains.
mental health care system, training of personnel for investing in mental health care services, and nonspecialist training for providing mental health care services. Dr. Radhakrishnan also deliberated on "National mental health plans during COVID-19". Sir explained his experience on the initiatives during the COVID like the national helpline for a psychosocial issues-multidisciplinary approach. It was an initiative of the Government of India. He explained on mental health education wing; national task force for preparation of manuals for primary care doctors, nurses in wellness centers, and ASHA workers; funded projects of TOT (trainer of the trainer) for providing psychosocial services; digital academy and Karnataka telementoring program. He also addressed the training of the Taluk doctors for providing mental health care services.

The moderator, Dr.Syed Imran then opened the floor to questions and comments. The panelists clarified the questions put forward by the delegates. Dr.Syed Imran concluded the panel discussion by acknowledging the contributions of the panelists for the session. Concluding remarks of the session was given by Dr.Leena K.C, Principal,Yenepoya Nursing College. Ms.Renita Monteiro, Lecturer, Department of Psychiatric Nursing thanked all the panelists and the audience for their participation and support.


Dr.Nageshwar V Reddy discussed the international mental health crisis during COVID 19 and explained the devastating experience of this pandemic all over the world, the gap between the health service system and community, the gap in the educational system, the financial crisis, and how it causes stress on people and industrial area. He discussed the statistics of the impact of COVID-19, psychological symptoms affected by the people worldwide, and budget allocation for mental health in the KSA and globally. Dr.Prabhu also added up uncertainty affected by all the domains of the life of the people, provision of health care facilities, and budget allocation for the mental health services in Australia and India.

Dr.Santhosh Prabu deliberated on COVID-19 impact on the mental health of the people and substance use, and suicide during the COVID-19. He pointed out the reasons for substance use such as lack of social connectedness, anxiety related to a pandemic, domestic violence, and financial crisis. He also explained the statistics on the suicide rate in India and worldwide, and also the main reasons for committing suicide.

Dr.Sreevani Rentala talked on psychosocial support and mental health interventions during COVID-19. She expressed her experience on psychosocial services provided by the Dharwad Institute of Mental Health and Neurosciences for the public especially for home quarantined people. The main thrust areas of the services provided by their institution are: mobile helpline services, telephonically counseling services for home quarantined and hospitalized patients affected with COVID; body-mind interventions such as body scan technique, breathing exercises, and progressive muscle relaxation techniques. These services are helped the people to get relief from tension, anxiety, fear, and sleep disturbances. Dr.Nagesh also explained about the protocol-based mental health care services provided in KSA.

Dr. Radhakrishnan Govindan spoke on "Role of the Universal health coverage during COVID-19)". Sir explained that the role of Universal Health Coverage (UHC) during this pandemic is a commitment by the nations at the United Nations and the aim of the Universal Health Coverage. He enlightened on the challenges in providing health care services such as economic disasters of countries, change in the policies and protocols of health care services, inadequate manpower, constraints on funding for services during the COVID pandemic, and change in the priorities of health care. Sir also explained on the recommendations of the UHC.

Dr.Nageshwar V Reddy deliberated on collaborations and partnerships to ensure that investment in mental health is prioritized, particularly during the COVID-19. He explained the importance of quality improved mental health programs including community-based mental health programs to ensure the investment in mental health care during this pandemic. He also recommended increasing the manpower resources in the

# Report on online 10th Intensive Summer Workshop on Ethics and Research (ISWEAR) 8-11 Jaly 2020 

## PROGRAM REPORT

Since the country still needs more persons to get trained in bioethics, so that their contribution within the IEC becomes more meaningful. Therefore, CFE as a part of Intensive Summer Workshop in Ethics and Research (1-SWEAR) program offers EC mentoring and GCP training to enable the participants to be tramed on basic ethical principles and assure the safety, integrity, and quality of clinical trials by addressing elements related to the design, conduct, and reporting of clinical trials.
The main focus of the workshop was to empower participants to understand locating ethics in research from historical wrongs. To explore areas of research involving human participants. To train people who is serving on institutional human ethics committees; or are likely to serve in the coming years, to give them the knowledge and tools to recognize and dea! with various ethical issues arising out of research being done on human subjects. The course also trained participants in Good Clinical Practice (GCP) along guidelines of the International Council for Harmonization (ICH).
Beneficharies:

- Students of the Post Graduate Diploma in Bioethics and Medical Ethics.
- Students of the Post Graduate Diploma in Clinical Ethics.
- Students of M.Sc Research Ethics Students.
- In-house and external participants from various disciplines: Pedodontics, pharmaco logy, anesthesia, periodontology, ophthalmology, advocate, MSW, Ayurveda, Hospital Administration, public health dentistry, oncology, ethics committec, community medicine, anatomy, prinicipal, microbiologist, oral pathology, oral surgery, physiology, pathologist, physiotherapy, lay person, director, anesthes iologist.


## Sessions

Converted $3^{\text {rd }}$ and $4^{\text {th }}$ modules of the Post Graduate Diploma in Bioethics and Medical Ethics into online modules. Following are the sessions conducted during the four days online workshop.

Day 1: What is research?, Ethies of clinical practice and clinical research, Methodology for ethical analysis: principles and theories, Vulnerability of research participants.

Day 2: Voluntary informed consent, Privacy and confidentiality in biomedical research, Assessment of risks and benefits in clinical rescarch, ICMR Guidelines, Transparency and social accountability in clinical research, Formation of ethics committees and protocols for mock ethics review.

Day 3: Laws and regulations related to clinical trials, Regulations for SAE and compensation, Practical aspects of scientific and economic organization of clinical trials, Conflict of Interes is, Groups discussion on mock proposal.


Day 4: Scientific misconduct, Ethics committees: Institutional and Independent,

Meeting of mock ethics committee and presentation, Ethical use of animals in research, Community engagement in research.

## Training method

1. The workshop was conducted 'online' in view of the COVID-19 pandemic related lockdown and travel restrictions, using Google meet.
2. The sessions included interactive lectures using power point presentation and educational short movies with appropriate examples.
3. The session was interspersed with interaction with the participants and clarification of doubts.

The participants were divided into five groups and assigned them with the mock proposals. Each group was asked to enact the role of the ethics commitee individually and put forth their opinion on the mock proposals received by them.

Report on 8 th Intensive Summer Workshop on Ethics and Research (l-SWEAR) 27-30 May 2019

## PROGRAM REPORT

The Centre for Ethics, Yenepoya deemed to be University, Mangalore success fully completed the 8 th edition of its annual fEature - Intensive Summer Workshop in Ethics and Research (ISWEAR). A total of 54 delegates registered and 51 actively participated in the workshop. Of these, 15 were from the medical fraternity, 17 from dental, 10 from Hospital Administration, 3 from M.Sc Research Ethics, 1 each from Physiotherapy, Literature and etc. 5 delegates were members of institutional ethics committees. On the first day, the Dr. Amar Jesani (Visiting Professor, Anusandhan Trust, Sai Ashraya Aram Society Road, Vakola Mumbai) inaugurated the program. The Director, Centre for Ethics - Dr. Vina Vaswani and the Karnataka Medical Council Observer - Dr. Chaitanya R Shetty (Assistant Professor, Dept of Orthopaedics, Yenepoya Medical College also graced the dais.

Dr. Ravi Vaswani introduced the delegates to the distinction between research, healthcare, innovation and experimentation; the differing-standards in research and practice were brought out through a case study. Dr. Amar Jesani shed light on the concepts of clinical equipoise and therapeutic misconceptions which are crucial in understanding research ethics. Dr. Una Kulkarni introduced the delegates to the principles and theories of ethics in research and their application in analysis of ethical issues in research. The afternoon session was focused on understanding the concept of vumerability in research with the screening of the educational movie "Ms. Ever's Boys" based on the Tuskegee syphilis trial. The ethical issues were discussed by Dr. Amar Jesani and this was followed by a presentation on identifying and managing vulnerability in research by Dr. Vina Vaswani.

The second day began with a recap of the previous day. Informed consent, its basis, importance, components and methods were discussed by Dr. Vina Vaswani. Importance of maintaining privacy of participants and confidentiality the data in clinical research were highlighted by Dr. Amar Jesani with the screening of a documentary. Dr. Ravi Vaswani conducted a session on Community engagemem in research for the need of issues in relevance of research to community, community benefits and its protection Community permission and consent - understanding power relations Culture sensitivity and developing cultural competence of rescarchers. Futher, Dr. Amar Iesani discussed risk: benefit analysis in clinical research and the methods of minimizing risk. In the post-lunch session, Dr Arun Bhatt spoke on the laws and regulations related to clinical trials. The day ended with Dr. Vina Vaswani dividing the delegates into four ehics committees and "mock research protocols" were given to the committees for review.

The third day included more advanced topics in research. After the recap, Dr. Arun Bhatt along with Dr. Mala Ramanathan spoke on the regulations governing Serious Adverse Events (SAE) reporting and compensation issues in research. He also spoke on the design and functioning of a climical tral, the role of Central Drugs Standard Control Organization (CDSCO).

Dr. Ravi Vaswani conducted session on ICMR Guidelines and clarified the concept of conflict of interests (Col), its identification and mitigation during the conduct of research, in the review processes of the ethics committees and in publications. Dr. Vina Vaswani spoke about Standards of care and post-trial benefits followed by Gromps discussion on mock proposal.

The last day focused on responsible conduct of research ( $R C R$ ). Dr. Mala Ramanathan spoke about the importance of transparency
and accountability Dr. Anant Bhan discussed on'scientific misconduct and Ethical use of anmals in

Research. Dr. Amar Jesani also discussed scientific misconduct and the importance of identifying and negating it. The afternoon scssion comprised the mock ethics committee meetings by the four groups, who were very enthusiastic and serious about the review processes. The session was judged by Dr. Anant Bhan and Dr. Amar Jesani. Overall, at the end of the fourth day, the delegates expressed their leaming experience as a very unique, enjoyable and frutful one. Feedback was collected from the KMC observer and from the delegates.

# Report on 7th Intensive Summer Workshop in Ethics and Research (I-SWEAR) May 28th to May 31st, 2018 

## PROGRAM REPORT

The Centre for Ethics, Yenepoya deemed to be University, Mangalore successfully completed the seventh edition of its annual feature - Intensive Summer. Workshop in Ethics and Research (ISWEAR). Apart from its growing popularity and consistency in the standard of training, the highlight of this year's program was the registration of four participants from across the borders of India -- Nepal -- for the first time. A total of 29 delegates registered and actively participated in the workshop. Of these, 14 were from the medical fraternity, 9 from dental and 6 from others like sociology. Six delegates were members of institutional ethics committees.

On the first day, the Vice Chancellor Dr. M Vijayakumar inaugurated the program. The Registrar Dr. GShreekumar Menon, Vice Principal, and Yenepoya Dental College - Dr. Sham Bhat, and the Karnataka Medical Council Observer - Dr. Cynthia Arunachalam also graced the dais.

Dr. Ravi Vaswani introduced the delegates to the distinction between research, healthcare, imnovation and experimentation; the differing standards in research and practice were brought out through a case study. Dr. Amar Jesani shed light on the concepts of clinical equipoise and therapeutic misconceptions which are crucial in understanding research ethics. Dr. Uma Kulkarni introduced the delegates to the principles and theories of ethics in research and their application in analys is of ethical issues in research. The afternoon
session was focused on understanding the concept of vumerability in research with the screening of the educational movie "Ms. Ever's Boys" based on the Tuskegee syphilis trial. The ethical issues were discussed by Dr. Amar Jesani and this was followed by a presentation on identifying and managing vulnerability in research by Dr. Uma Kulkarni.

The third day included more advanced topics in research. After the recap, Dr. Arum Bhatt spoke on the regulations governing Serious Adverse Events (SAE) reporting and compensation issues in research. He also spoke on the design and functioning of a clinical trial, the role of Central Drugs Standard Control Organization (CDSCO) and insurance issues. Community engagement in research was discussed by Dr. Abhay Nirgude and Dr. Mala Ramanathan with the hetp of case vignettes and group discussions. Dr. Ravi Vaswani clarified the concept of conflict of interests (Col), its idenification and mitigation during the conduct of research, in the review processes of the ethics committecs and in publications. A documentary highlighting the ethics of publication was sereened. In the post-lunch session, Dr. Anant Bhan discussed about the importance of understanding the standards of care and post-rial access/benefits in clinical research.


The last day focused on responsible conduct of research (RCR). Dr. Malar Ramanathan spoke about the importance of transparency and accountability; and Dr. Anant Bhan and Dr. Amor Jesani discussed scientific misconduct and the importance of identifying and negating it. The morning session ended with a talk on ethical issues in animal research by Dr, Anat Bhan. The afternoon session comprised the mock ethics committee meetings by the four groups, who were very enthusiastic and serious about the review process. The session was judged by Dr. Anant Bhan and Dr. Mala Ramanathan. Overall, at the end of the fourth day, the delegates expressed their learning experience as a very unique, enjoyable and fruitful one. Feedback was collected from the KMC observer and from the delegates.

## PROGRAM REPORT

The brief inaugural programme was conducted on 29th of May 2017 at 10.30a.m. Dr. Sripathi Rao, Principal YDC attended the inaugural program. Dr. Vasudha Devi, Professor and Head of the Department of Pharmacology, Melaka Manipal University, was appointed as Observer for the workshop.

## PGDFAO 2017 - Module 1-Report

The First module of Post Graduate Diploma in Forensic Anthropology began from 20 March 2017 to 25 March 2017 and was attended by 15 candidates enrolled for the course including one candidate who had missed last year (Dr Frank Antony Britto, PGDFAO 2016 Batch). One of the candidates (Dr Mithun Kulambi) was absent and will be attending the module with the next batch (PGDFAO 2018). The resource persons for First module were Dr. Luis Fondebrider, President Of Equipo Argentino de Antropologia (EAAF), Dr. Douglas H.
