1. INTRODUCTION

Advanced Comprehensive Clinical Training and Simulation Center (ACTS-Yen) is a unique Centre and the largest state-of-the art simulation facility in the country with the latest simulators in the offering. Integrating simulation, in graduate and post graduate curriculum, should facilitate more ethical training with least harm and discomfort to patient. Multi-disciplinary & team training for emergency situations will result in better team dynamics, communication and behavioral skills and more realistic training. It's bring the gap between technology and use of technology in advanced teaching in healthcare. It emphasis the cardinal objective of healthcare system to focus on more patient safety and it can achieve only by reducing medical errors . It is state of the art facility with high fidelity manikins and task trainers for end to end hands on skill training for all the kinds of healthcare providers. Yenepoya University aims at integrating skill development and simulation training into the existing curriculum by using innovative technology.

ACTS YEN caters to all students and faculty health care professional of Yenepoya University and also aims to impart basic skills like Basic life support to the community at a large. The focus is on providing skills training which leads to value addition.

2. 2 Infrastructure and location

Yenepoya University Simulation centre and skills laboratory - Advanced Comprehensive Clinical Training And Simulation Centre (ACTS YEN), was commissioned in January 2016. ACTS YEN is located in the Emergency Medicine Department Building on the 8th floor. It boasts of a state of the art infrastructure, centrally air conditioned complex spread over more than 9,000 square feet, well equipped with a wide range high fidelity mannequins and virtual reality simulators. It also has an indoor auditorium with capacity to accommodate 250 people and two debriefing rooms.

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There are five High fidelity simulators, three Virtual Reality Simulators and several blue phantoms mannequins, adult and baby half body mannequins for basic and advanced cardiac life support training, Opthosim, Otosim and Ultra sound simulators. ACTS YEN also houses Anatomage or Virtual dissection table. Several task trainers are also available for improving the skills of students and trainee health professional.

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Service Agreements

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SERVICE AGREEMENT

This Service Agreement ("Agreement") is made on this 21st of January, 2019 by and between; Yenepoya (deemed to be a University) Medical Simulation Lab, an educational institution, deemed university having its office at Advanced Comprehensive Training and Simulation Center(ACTS-YEN), Yenepoya (Deemed to be University) Simulation Lab, University Road, Deralakatte, Mangaluru Pin: 575018 Karnataka (hereinafter referred to as "Service Provider" which expression shall, unless repugnant to the context or meaning thereof, be deemed to mean and include its successors and permitted assigns) of the One Part

AND

ABBOTT INDIA PRIVATE LIMITED, a company incorporated in India under the Companies Act, 1956 and having its Registered Office at 3, Corporate Park, Sion-Trombay Road, Chembur, Mumbai – 400071, and having its corporate office at Floor 18, Godrej BKC, Plot No. C – 68, BKC, Near MCA Club, Bandra (E) Mumbai – 400 051, through its healthcare solutions division (hereinafter referred to as "Client/Abbott") (which expression shall unless it be repugnant to the content or meaning thereof include its successors and assigns and its legal representatives)

Service Provider and Client are hereinafter referred to individually as "Party" and jointly as "Parties".

WHEREAS:

- A. Service Provider is, inter alia, engaged in imparting training for educational purposes to doctors and healthcare professionals on various therapy areas and medical disciplines
- B. Client is engaged in the business of manufacturing and marketing pharmaceutical products.
- C. Client expressed its interest in associating with the Service Provider for obtaining the Services (as defined hereinafter) of the Service Provider. Service Provider is desirous of providing aforesaid Services to the Client and represents that it has the wherewithal and adequate, experienced and competent resources for rendering such Services;
- D. In view of the foregoing, Service Provider and Client have mutually agreed to enter in to this Agreement on terms and conditions mentioned herein below.

THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing and the mutual covenants and promises contained herein and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and adequacy of which is hereby acknowledged, the Parties intending to be bound legally, agree as follows:

1. SERVICES

- 1.1 Subject to the terms and conditions set forth in this Agreement, Service Provider shall:
- a) provide the Services to Client as specified in Annexure A hereto and in accordance with the requirements/specifications of the Client ("Services").
- b) perform the Services in a competent and professional manner with all reasonable skill, accuracy and care in accordance with good industry practice and the Services shall be performed by individuals who have sufficient training, expertise for the task at hand.
- not engage itself in activities that would prevent or hinder the performance of its obligations under this Agreement.
- d) be solely and exclusively responsible for and arrange and bear costs of such equipment's, materials as Service Provider considers necessary to render effectively Services as required by the Client.
- be solely and exclusively responsible and liable for payment of salaries, wages and all other statutory dues of the staff who are employed by the for the purpose of rendering the service required by the Client under this Agreement and shall pr.Gangadhara Registrar University)

Dr.Gangagnala Registrar Yenepoya(Deemed to be University) University Road, Deralakatte Mangalore-575 018, Karnataka maintain proper books of accounts, records and documents and comply with all statutes, rules and regulations which are applicable to it for the fulfillment of the terms of this Agreement.

- f) shall not engage in any activities related to the Services unless they are specifically permitted by or approved by Abbott in writing.
- g) assign the contact points as specified in **Annexure B** hereto, to ensure implementation of this Agreement and/or performance of its obligations herein. In the event of change in any such contact points, Service Provider shall provide reasonable prior notice to Client of the same.
- h) maintain proper books of accounts, records and documents during the Term and comply with all statutes, rules and regulations in relation to the performance of its obligations under this Agreement.
- i) not use the name of Client i.e 'Abbott' or any of its trade names or trademarks in any manner whatsoever except to the extent necessary for providing the Services hereunder. It is clearly understood and agreed that Client shall not in any way be responsible for the debts, liabilities or obligations of the Service Provider and/or its staff which are not approved by the Client and/or not related to this Agreement.
- j) Not engage in any activities other than the Services unless specifically approved or permitted by Client in writing in relation to this Agreement.

2. CONSIDERATION

- 2.1. In consideration of the Services to be provided by the Service Provider in accordance with the terms and conditions of this Agreement, Client agrees to pay Service Provider a total project fee of INR 30,000 /- per workshop ("Project Fee") as more particularly set out on Annexure C hereto. The tax component shall be clearly set out in the invoice.
- 2.2. The Service Provider shall promptly raise invoice for the Services rendered and in any case within 10 days of completion of the month. Abbott shall not entertain any bill, if it is not submitted within a period of 6 months. Payment shall be made within 90 (Ninety) days of receipt of invoice from Service Provider.
- 2.3. If Abbott disputes any invoice in whole or in part, then it shall notify the Service Provider of such dispute in writing within ten (10) working days of receipt of the invoice, and the Parties shall use all reasonable endeavors to settle the dispute within fifteen (15) days and the invoice amount shall be payable immediately on resolution of the dispute. Until such resolution of dispute, Abbott shall only pay undisputed portion of the impugned invoice in terms of this clause.
- 2.4. The invoice shall be raised by the Service Provider only for the agreed Services. If any additional incidental work is required to be undertaken by the Service Provider in connection with the Services, which would entail additional cost, the same shall pr.Gangadhara Somayai same shall pr.Gangadhara Somayai same shall

be first discussed between the Parties and undertaken by the Service Provider only upon written approval from the Client.

- 2.5. Service Provider shall produce duplicates of the supporting bills as proof along with original invoice of Service Provider for all costs incurred by it or its associates for the purpose of rendering the Services hereunder. However, during the Term of this Agreement when requested by the Client, within seven (7) days of such request by the Client, Service Provider shall produce the original supporting bills for Client's verification. Notwithstanding anything herein, Client shall not pay or provide reimbursement for any charges/expenses incurred without Client's written consent and shall require proof of expense, wherever possible, even when consent has been obtained. Out of pocket expenses shall be billed at actuals, provided that the same are with such pre-requisite approvals.
- 2.6. Client shall not be liable to pay any other amount whatsoever including by way of reimbursement to the Service Provider, other than the Project Fee towards the Services, and out of pocket expenses in the manner as set out under this Clause 2. Client shall not at any time during this Agreement be liable to make any separate payment/s to third party/ies to whom any part of the Services provided hereunder have been outsourced by the Service Provider which is principally required to be rendered by the Service Provider.
- 2.7. Each Party shall be solely responsible and shall pay in a timely manner, all direct and indirect taxes for which the respective Party is the taxpayer pursuant to applicable law pertaining to, arising out of or attributable to the transaction contemplated under this Agreement and also file all appropriate returns for the same.
- 2.8. Client will deduct applicable taxes (as D Y Patil university is exempted from GST, only 2% TDS will be applicable) at source before making payment of the invoice to the Service Provider and agrees to provide the relevant certificate to the Service Provider.

3. REPRESENTATIONS AND WARRANTIES

3.1. Representations and Warranties of each Party

For the purposes of this Agreement, each Party represents and warrants to the other that:

- a) It is a corporation duly organized, validly existing and in good standing under the laws of the jurisdiction in which it is incorporated.
- b) It has the corporate power and authority and the legal right to enter into this Agreement and to perform its obligations hereunder and has taken all necessary corporate action on its part to authorize the execution and delivery of this Agreement, and the performance of its obligations hereunder somayaji K.S.

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c) The execution, delivery and performance of its obligations under this Agreement do not and will not contravene any law, regulation, order, judgment or decree applicable to it or conflict with or result in any breach or default under any agreement, instrument, regulation, license or authorization binding upon it or any of its assets, any confidentiality, non-compete or similar or other obligations with any person or entity or party.

3.2. Representations and Warranties of Service Provider

For the purposes of this Agreement, Service Provider represents and warrants that:

- a) It has the necessary rights, experience, resources, competence and power to execute, deliver and perform its obligations under the Agreement and all necessary authorizations and other sanction has been taken to authorize such execution, delivery and performance.
- b) it will perform and is capable of performing the Services consistent with the professional skill, care, and diligence exercised by entities licensed to provide (where required under applicable laws) and regularly providing comparable Services and work on projects of similar size, complexity, design, and cost, and always in accordance with Good Industry Practice.
 - "Good Industry Practice" for the purposes of this clause shall mean those practices, methods, techniques, standards, skills, diligence and prudence which are generally and reasonably expected from a reasonably skilled and experienced entity engaged in the same type of undertaking or activity as the Service Provider under this Agreement, and which would be expected to result in the performance of obligations by the Service Provider in accordance with this Agreement.
- c) In the performance of its obligations under this Agreement, it will comply with all central, state and local laws, regulations and guidance documents including, but not limited to, privacy and data protection laws, regulations and guidelines; tax laws and regulations; labour laws and regulations, including laws relating to anti-corruption and anti-bribery such as the United States Foreign Corrupt Practices Act, 1977, United Kingdom's Bribery Act and anti-bribery laws in India, as amended from time to time. Service Provider shall obtain and keep in full force and effect any licenses, certifications, permits or registrations necessary for Service Provider to carry out its business activities and Services provided under this Agreement.
- d) neither the Services nor any materials, deliverables provided under this Agreement shall have any defects. In case of any defects in any deliverables due to reason solely attributable to the Service Provider then the Service Provider shall rectify the same within mutually agreed timelines.
- e) it has valid licenses, authorizations, permissions, consents, approvals required under applicable laws or otherwise and is under no conflicting obligations to enter into this arrangement and to render the Services and provide the deliverables in accordance with this Agreement.

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- f) there are no pending claims, actions, suits or proceedings against it or affecting any of its assets and there has been no event or occurrence which in each case, might reasonably be expected to have a material adverse effect on its ability to perform its obligations hereunder.
- g) the Services or deliverables provided under this Agreement will not infringe on any copyright, trademark, trade secret or other intellectual property right of any third party and during the performance of its obligations under this Agreement, it shall not use the trademarks, copyrights or any other intellectual property of a third party or provide the same to Abbott without due authorization consent or license of such third party. Service Provider agrees to defend, indemnify and hold harmless the Client, its parent, subsidiaries, affiliates, employees and representatives, for all costs and expenses associated with the defense or settlement of any claim, that the Services infringe a patent, copyright, trademark, trade secret or other intellectual property right and shall pay any judgments or settlements costs based thereon.
- h) it is the lawful owner of all materials used by it in the performance of the Services contemplated hereunder that have not been provided by Client; such materials have been lawfully acquired by the Service Provider and Service Provider has the right to permit Client use of such materials.
- i) it shall not make any payment on behalf of Client to any doctors, healthcare professionals or their equivalents except as approved by the Client for the purpose of and in connection with rendering Services hereunder.
- j) it shall, neither by itself nor through any persons employed or acting on its behalf (including employees, directors, agents, consultants, or approved subcontractors) give, offer, or promise to give, directly or indirectly, or accept, receive or agree to accept or receive anything of value (including, but not limited to, money, services, product samples, commissions, contributions, fees, gifts, bribes, rebates, payoffs, travel expenses, entertainment, influence payments, kickbacks or any other payment), regardless of form, to any person (including the Professionals) to secure a business advantage, to obtain or retain business or to direct business to or away from any entity.
- k) it shall not provide any facilitation, expediting, or grease payment to any Government Official to expedite or secure the performance of routine government actions.
- 1) neither it nor any of its officer, director or employee or any of its affiliate's ("Representatives"), is a Government Official. If at any time during the Term of this Agreement, Service Provider anticipates that any Representative has or may become a Government Official, Service Provider will immediately notify Abbott in writing, providing relevant details of the relationship and either (i) certifying that such individual will not perform the Services hereunder or (ii) the precautions Service Provider shall put in place to ensure no improper advantage shall arise or be implied from individual's position as a Government Official. At its sole discretion, Abbott may give its written consent and require Service Provider to such additional

conditions as Abbott may determine. If, for any reason, Abbott is unable or unwilling to consent to the relationship and Service Provider proceeds, Abbott may terminate this Agreement by written notice to the Service Provider.

- m) For the purpose of this Agreement, the term "Government Official" means any officer or employee of a Government Authority or any department, agency or instrumentality thereof, including state-owned and state-controlled entities, or of a public international organization, or any person acting in an official capacity for or on behalf of any such government, department, agency, or instrumentality or on behalf of any such public international organization. "Governmental Authority" means any foreign, domestic, federal, territorial, state or local governmental authority of any nature, or body exercising, or entitled to exercise, any administrative, executive, judicial, legislative, police, regulatory, customs, immigration, or taxing authority or power of any nature. Officers and employees of government hospitals, research institutions, universities, and other healthcare institutions or facilities are Government Officials for purposes of this Agreement.
- n) Violations of sub clauses (i), (j), (k) and (l) shall be deemed to be a material breach and shall entitle Abbott to terminate this Agreement with immediate effect and without payment of any compensation.

4. PROVIDED ITEMS

Client may supply Service Provider with confidential information, materials and related information for use in the Services (collectively "Provided Items"). Service Provider agrees that all Provided Items are the sole property of the Client. Service Provider disclaims any rights to the aforementioned Provided Items and will assert no claim, copyright, patent or otherwise, to their use, development and/or production. Service Provider shall use the Provided Items solely for the Services under the terms of this Agreement and the relevant statement of work/Deliverables, not employ them for any other purposes, and not provide them to any third party without Client's prior written consent. Service Provider shall not place any lien or encumbrance on any Provided Items while in Service Provider's possession, and shall not allow any third party to place any such lien or encumbrance on any Provided Items.

5. INDEMNITY

5.1. Service Provider agrees to indemnify and shall at all times hold Client, its directors, officers, employees, (each a "Client Indemnified Person"), harmless and indemnified at all times hereafter, from and against any loss, liabilities, claims, damages, costs, including reasonable attorney's fees and legal costs (incurred whether in protection or defense) to which the Client Indemnified Person may be subjected, arising on account of and/or by reason of (i) breach by the Service Provider of the terms and conditions of this Agreement including but not limited to the representations and warranties contained in this Agreement; (ii) any infringement of any third party rights including Intellectual Property Rights: (iii) Dr.Gangadhara Somayaji K.S.

Registrar Yenepoya(Deemed to be University) University Road, Deralakatte Mangalore-575 018, Karnataka acts or omission involving wilful misconduct, fraud, gross negligence on the part of the Service Provider or its directors, employees, representatives.

5.2. In the event of a claim, action or allegation for which indemnification is requested; the Client Indemnified Person as the case may be, will promptly notify the other in writing, of such action, claim or legal proceeding. Each Party agrees to provide opportunity to other Party to participate in any compromise, settlement or resolution or disposition of such action, claim or suit provided that any such participation shall be only with prior consent of Abbott. Subject to an agreement to maintain the confidentiality of records, papers or other information, each Party agrees to make available to the Client Indemnified Person as the case may be, any relevant records, papers or information and shall co-operate in such defense as reasonably required.

6. TERM AND TERMINATION

6.1. Term

This Agreement shall come in force from 21st February 2019 ("Effective Date") and will be valid up to 20th February 2020("Term"). Abbott shall be entitled to terminate this Agreement by giving thirty (30) days' written notice to the Service Provider with assigning reason whatsoever. On expiry of the Term, the Agreement may be renewed if mutually agreed to in writing by both Parties on mutually acceptable terms and conditions.

6.2. Termination

Notwithstanding anything contained herein, Abbott shall at its sole and absolute discretion, be entitled to terminate this Agreement forthwith by giving written notice if:

- a) if in the opinion of Abbott (which shall not be called in question by the Service Provider and shall be binding on the Service Provider) Service Provider has caused Material breach of this Agreement and the breach remains uncured for a period of thirty (30) days after notice of the breach without prejudice to any other rights and remedies available to Abbott under this Agreement or by law or in equity; or
- b) if Service Provider suffers any insolvency proceeding, either voluntary or involuntary, or is adjudicated bankrupt or makes any assignment for the benefit of creditors. Such termination will not relieve Service Provider in proceedings from liability for the performance of its obligations arising prior to such termination and will be in addition to all other rights and remedies Abbott may have available to it under this Agreement or at law or in equity.
- c) For the purposes of this clause, "Material breach" shall mean event in which either Party fails in any respect to perform or exercise or comply with any of its deliverables, warranties, rights and obligations respectively or where either Party causes or may cause adverse effect upon the other Party's ability to faitful the terms of this Agreement.

6.3. Effects of Termination:

Termination of this Agreement for any reason shall not release either Party hereto from any liability which, at the time of such termination, has already accrued to the other Party or which is attributable to a period prior to such termination, and will not preclude Abbott from pursing all rights and remedies it may have.

Upon termination of this Agreement for any reason:

- the Parties shall immediately take steps to bring the performance of their obligations under this Agreement to a halt in a safe and orderly manner but with all reasonable speed and economy;
- b) Either Party will as soon as practicable cease to use and promote the other Party's trademarks, logos and brands, if any;
- c) Either Party shall, notwithstanding any lien or any other right to withhold the same, immediately shall cease use of any confidential information provided to it by the disclosing Party to perform its obligations under this Agreement and return / destroy (as instructed by the disclosing Party) all confidential information provided under this Agreement;
- d) The Parties will mutually prepare and settle the accounts in terms of this Agreement each Party shall promptly deliver to the other Party or otherwise dispose of in accordance with the other Party's directions copies of all documents, records and other property supplied by or on behalf of the other Party as may be in its possession;
- e) If the termination is due to reasons attributable to the Client, then the Client shall, within 90 (Ninety) days from the receipt of invoice, clear all payments as may have been incurred by the Service Provider in order to fulfill its obligations under this Agreement up to the date of termination.
- f) The provisions of indemnity, confidentiality and Intellectual Property Rights shall survive the termination of this Agreement.

Upon expiry or termination of this Agreement, Service Provider Shall instruct the

- 7.3. Materials Developed for Client. The Parties hereby acknowledge and agree that the intellectual property rights in the services and deliverables developed by the Service Provider under this Agreement and as may be more particularly specified in the Annexure A shall be owned by the Client and the Service Provider shall not have any rights of any nature whatsoever in the same. It is clarified for the avoidance of doubt that such Services and deliverables shall not include any Service Provider Property or Client Property or any third party intellectual property. The Service Provide or its employees or representatives shall do all such acts or execute all such documents as may be required to perfect the title of the Client in the Services and deliverables.
- 7.4. The rights and obligations stated above shall survive any expiry or termination of this Agreement. Except as specifically authorized in this clause neither Party will use the other Party's brands, name, trademarks or logos without the prior written consent of the other Party. The Parties agree that a Party's brand name and logo shall at all time be used only in connection with the Services and deliverables.

8. TRAINING



Our ASSEND started with the view to enhance the surgical skills for the budding surgeons. In current century minimal invasive surgeries are gaining upper hand day by day. The reasons behind this are minimal incision, fast healing, less tissue damage, less or no identifiable scar, less post op care and early discharge from the hospital.

In ASSEND the minimally invasive surgical techniques like Robotic, in collaboration with Intuitive surgical private limited and Laparoscopic surgical skill training, Transplantation techniques with respect to Liver and Kidneys are also being imparted. After getting the clearance from the Government of India, we started our first internal program on 23rd April 2019 and external program on 12th June 2019. Till 31st December 2020 a total of 27 laparoscopic training sessions are conducted, out of which 3 programs were in collaboration with Verwandeln Institute, Kochi, and more than 122 surgeons from various parts of India and one from UAE have attended. On 23rd of October 2019 our first robotic skill training program was started. Till 31st December, a total of 15 training programs have been conducted and in each training single surgeon has been trained along with 4 assistant surgeons. A total of 42 programs have been conducted and 143 surgeons have been benefitted till 31st December 2020.

Currently we have approval for 5 training protocols under laparoscopic surgery, robotic surgery, liver transplantation, renal transplantation, ARDS model.

This unit is under the direct supervision of our Vice Chancellor Dr. M. Vijayakumar, who is a senior surgical oncologist







And performed tracheostomy on emergency basis in between 1.15 – 1.30. Around 2.00 to 2.15 the monitor started displaying erratic readings with respect to EtCO2 and other parameters were flat graph. Whereas pulseoximeter was showing the oxygen saturation level and the heart rate. We did CPR. But nothing worked for our side. They requested for another animal as there were still many exercises to be done with respect to vessels. Animal was provided.

While performing tracheostomy cellulitis was noticed, sloughed out tissue noticed.
