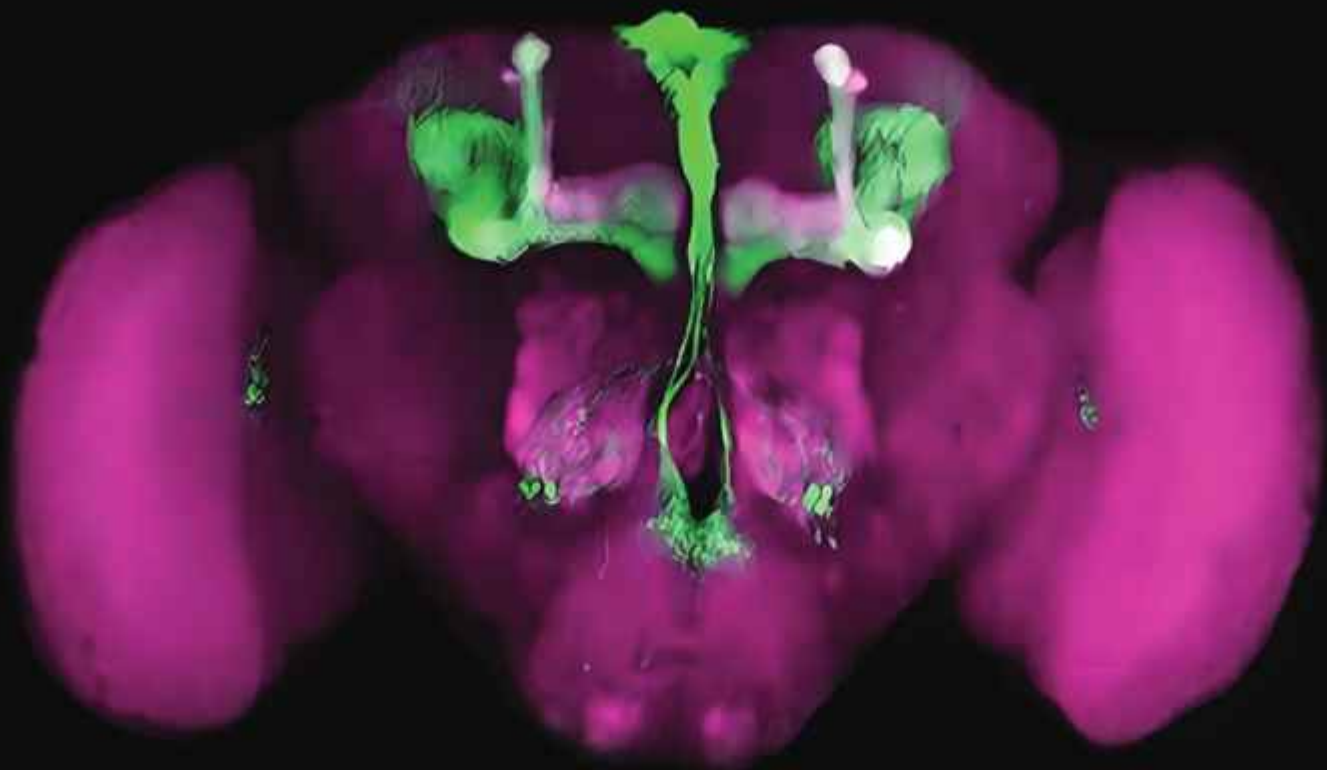

DEPARTMENT OF PHARMACOLOGY

As part of Yenepoya Medical College's silver jubilee celebration, a national workshop was organized by Department of Pharmacology, YMC and YPCRC in collaboration with Jel Tek LLP to revitalize academic experimental pharmacology using advanced technologies. Over 50 participants, including students and faculty from various reputed institutions in Karnataka and Madhya Pradesh, took part in this two-day event. Participants were also introduced to advanced devices that support the 3Rs concept (Replacement, Reduction, Refinement) in animal experimentation, provided by Jel Tek LLP. A panel discussion focused on the significance of academic research and the balance between academic and industrial pharmacological research. The event fostered networking, knowledge exchange, and learning, laying the foundation for future workshops aimed at promoting ethical practices and advancing research capabilities in the field of pharmacology.

CDE PROGRAM- EXPLORING MULTI-MODALITY IMAGING OF MAXILLOFACIAL DISEASES



The Department of Oral Medicine and Radiology organized a Continuing Dental Education (CDE) program on 'Exploring Multi-Modality Imaging of Maxillofacial Diseases'. The program commenced with a talk by Dr. Laxmikanth Chatra, Principal, YDC. Dr. Sanjay Mallya, Chair, Oral & Maxillofacial Radiology, Associate Professor Residency Program Director (Oral & Maxillofacial Radiology) UCLA School of Dentistry, California, USA was the resource person for the event.

The program aimed to educate dental professionals about the various multi-

modality techniques including applications of Computed Tomography (CT) and Cone-Beam Tomography (CBCT) especially the application of Dual Energy CBCT in diagnosing various maxillofacial diseases, emphasizing the significant role of imaging technologies in improving diagnostic accuracy and treatment outcomes. The lecture consisted of staging of bone lesions such as osteoradionecrosis and radiographic evaluation of such lesions in context of CBCT and CT imaging and how it has improved the treatment outcomes. 75 students and 30 teachers were benefitted from this event.

PEDIATRIC AND PREVENTIVE DENTISTRY NOIS WORKSHOP



A two-day Nitrous Oxide Oxygen Inhalation Sedation (NOIS) work shop was conducted by Dr. Srinivas Namineni, at the Department of Paediatric and Preventive Dentistry at Yenepoya Dental College. Bharat, together reflect our commitment to nation building and contributions to sustainable development goals (SDGs).



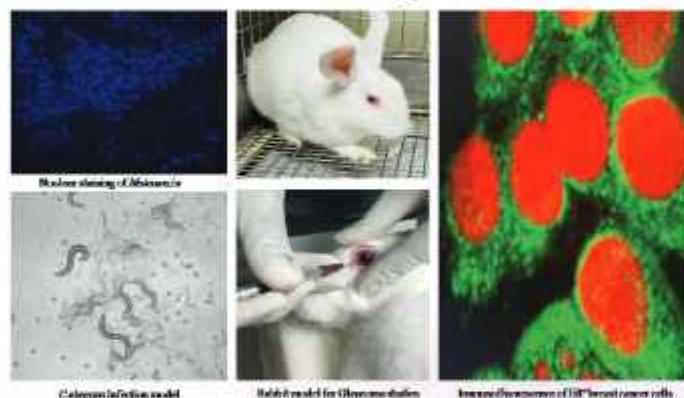
RESEARCH DIVISIONS

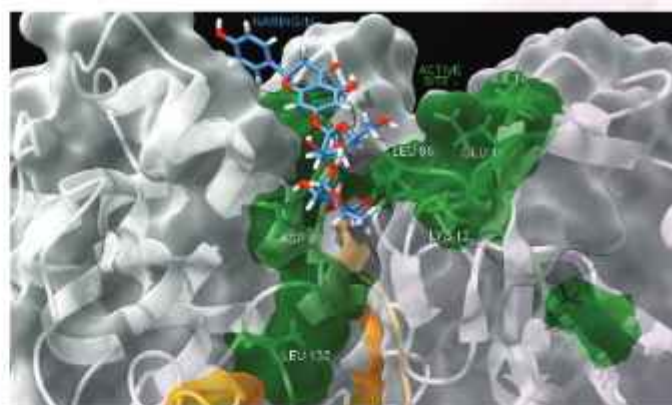


2. Centre for Systems Biology and Molecular Medicine: This division addresses clinical

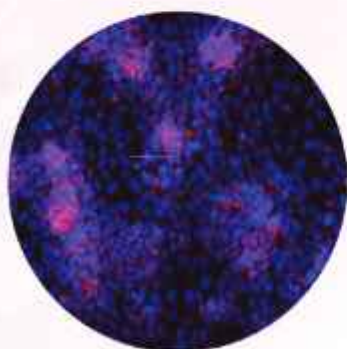

RESEARCH IMPACT

The research impact of YRC is diverse, meaning that we have contributed to the advancement of basic scientific knowledge, extended research support to colleges, universities, institutions and commercial entities comprising of both national and international clientele through contract research services at an economical cost, and also contributed to the generation of translatable knowledge with commercial value. Our publications, patents, the start-ups driven by in-house research groups, extramural grants and fellowships, a growing alumni of postgraduate and doctoral students and a growing list of beneficiaries of our research services reflect the array of our contributions to the scientific community as well as to the society in general.

PUBLICATIONS

With a total of 593 publications, YRC has established itself as a leading contributor to scientific literature. Our research publications have garnered substantial attention as evidenced by a H-index of 34, a metric that reflects the cumulative impact of our research output and performance and that measures the quantity with quality by comparing the publications to number of citations. These achievements not only showcase the quality of our research areas and themes, but also reflect their relevance to the ongoing research programs across the world and to the current societal issues.



PATENTS

WORLD SANSKRIT DAY-2024



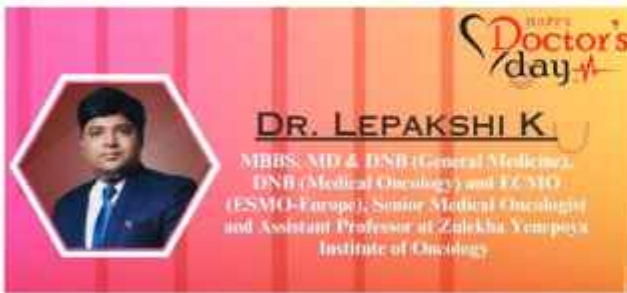

YENEPOYA PHARMACY COLLEGE & RESEARCH CENTRE

ASSEND & SMALL ANIMAL HOUSE VISIT

The IV semester B Pharm students and II-year D Pharm students visited the small animal house, ASSEND, and the Individual Ventilated Caging (IVC) system as part of their academic curriculum. During their visit to the animal house, they observed different animal species, including Wistar albino rats, Swiss albino mice, and C57 Balb-C black mice. The students were introduced to various blood withdrawal techniques and routes of drug administration. They also learned about personal hygiene, and the requirements and maintenance of the animal house in accordance with CCSEA guidelines, which cover physical facilities, animal husbandry, including caging, bedding materials, water systems, humidity, temperature control, and feeding. At the Advanced Surgical Skill Enhancement Division (ASSEND), students explored the Endo Training Area, Pre-Anaesthetic Room, Laparoscopic Unit, and Robotic Training Unit. Veterinary surgeons Dr. Suprith Surya and Dr. Shodhan demonstrated minimally invasive surgical techniques, such as robotic and laparoscopic surgeries, along with transplantation procedures for the liver and kidneys. Beginners practiced on endo-trainers to improve hand-eye coordination before transitioning to live animal models. Students were also taught practical skills such as handling energy devices, managing cameras, port placement, and abdominal insufflation under Dr. Suprith Surya's guidance. ASSEND provides training to healthcare professionals, including postgraduates, specialists, and super specialists, in areas like laparoscopic and robotic surgeries, as well as liver and renal transplantation techniques.

PHARMAPULSE 3.0- A SIMULATION WORKSHOP

The Department of Pharmacology at Yenepoya Pharmacy College & Research Centre organized a workshop, "PHARMA PULSE 2.0," at ACTSYEN and EMD Auditorium. The event, aimed at providing hands-on training, began with an inauguration hosted by Mrs. Fathima Fakhruddin. EDUCATIONAL VISIT TO SOLARA ACTIVE PHARMA SCIENCES

The Eco Club of Yenepoya Pharmacy College & Research Centre, in collaboration with the Department of Pharmaceutics, organized an educational visit to Solara Active Pharma Sciences in Baikampady, Mangaluru accompanied by eco club coordinator, Dr. Bhagya Sharma. The visit aimed to provide students with practical insights into the pharma industry. The students were briefed on industry regulations and given first-hand knowledge of operations, technologies,

and management practices. They toured the facility, observing industrial processes and equipment. Ms. Jyoti explained the wastewater management system, multiple effect evaporator, and acid-alkali neutralizer, emphasizing the environmental impact of industrial activities. The group also visited Sequent Scientific Private Ltd, where they learned about quality control analysis. The visit concluded with a networking session, allowing students to interact with industry professionals and explore future internship and job opportunities. The experience provided valuable feedback and professional connections.

GURUDAKSHTA-3. O

The Guru Dakshatha event, focused on enhancing teaching effectiveness, promoting research and innovation, and developing leadership among faculty at Yenepoya Institute of Arts, Science, Commerce & Management was inaugurated by Dr. Arun A. GUEST TALK

The session began with a welcome note by Mrs. Deeksha Rai, Head of the Department of Pharmacognosy. Dr. Beena Antony provided a detailed explanation of anaerobic microorganisms and their significance. She discussed the challenges associated with culturing anaerobes, noting that only 30% of researchers focus on them due to their requirement for oxygen-free environments. Dr. Antony highlighted the potential applications of anaerobes in the pharmaceutical industry and ongoing research in this field. She also presented images of various anaerobic microorganisms and their culturing techniques. The session concluded with Dr. Antony addressing students' queries.

STAFF DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM FOR NON-TEACHING STAFF & TEACHING STAFF ON SOFT SKILLS & GOOD LABORATORY PRACTICES

The proposed training workshop aimed to enhance the skills of lab attendants and non-teaching staff, many of whom were new to the field, by introducing them to "Good Laboratory Practices in Pharmacy Educational Institutes." The workshop focused on improving their ability to handle chemicals, anatomical models, crude drugs, and maintain laboratory records, stock books, and uphold the code of conduct in experimental labs. After the training, both teaching and non-teaching staff were informed about staff welfare benefits, including leave policies and medical insurance. On the second day, participants received hands-on training to improve their computer skills, helping to increase efficiency in the workplace. The final session focused on soft skills, particularly communication and professionalism in the work environment.

STUDY VISIT TO SEWAGE TREATMENT PLANT

The Department of Pharmaceutical Chemistry at Yenepoya Pharmacy College & Research Centre organized a one-day study visit to the Sewage Treatment Plant (STP) at Yenepoya (Deemed to be University). The visit commenced after lunch with a formal introduction by the resource person at the STP. The resource person provided an in-depth explanation of the sewage treatment process, detailing the number of STP plants on campus, their operational categories, and the types of water being recycled. The sources of the water included hostels, canteens, the central kitchen, hospitals, and colleges. Yenepoya University has two STP plants and one Effluent Treatment Plant (ETP). During the visit, students explored one STP that recycles wastewater collected from the boys' hostels and the central kitchen. The treatment process involves removing solid, semi-solid and liquid wastes through

screening, sand filtration, aeration and additional filtration methods. After the treatment, the recycled water is utilized for toilets and irrigation of plants.

The students gained valuable insights into sewage treatment processes, which sparked research inquiries regarding water contamination levels and the potential for conducting antimicrobial activity analysis.

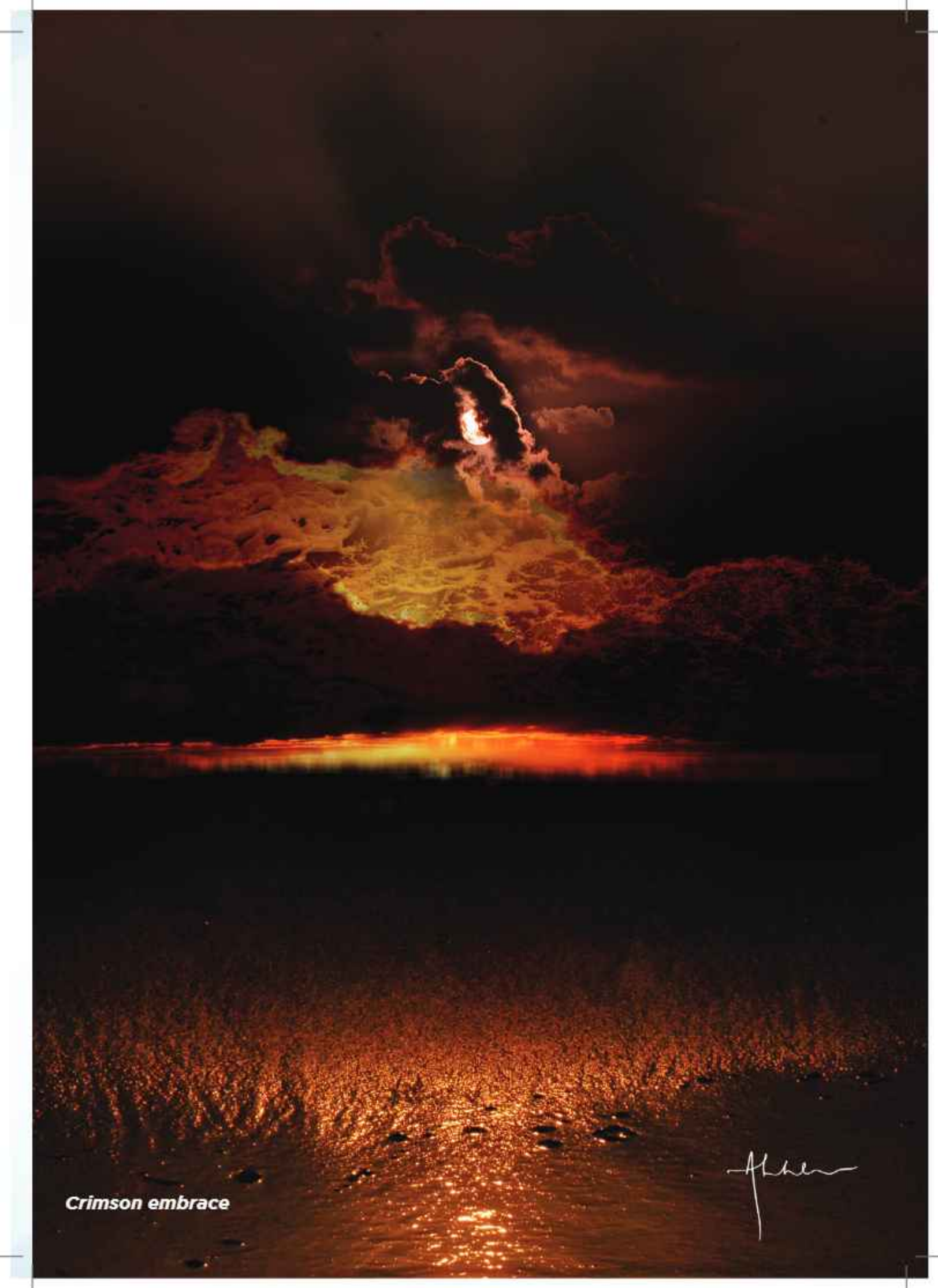
